CO-CREATING DIGITAL LEARNING PROJECTS



On **3-5 November 2025**, EKA hosted the D'Learn Project Lab, an international collaboration event organised by the **European Digital Learning Network (D'Learn)**.

The workshop gathered 30 partners from across Europe to jointly design and refine new Erasmus+ cooperation project ideas focused on digital learning, AI-enhanced education, and innovative training methodologies.

This collaborative format supports evidence-based project development and reinforces the university's engagement in the European digital education ecosystem.

STRENGTHENING ACADEMIC TIES IN GHANA



From **11-14 November**, Assoc. Prof. **Vita Zariņa** and Asst. Prof. **Ksenija Milča** visited the **University of Professional Studies, Accra (UPSA)**, **Ghana**, as part of expanding academic cooperation.

Assoc. Prof. Zariņa delivered an invited lecture, "**Financial Accounting and Corporate Financial Management**," offering students valuable insights into global financial practices and strategic decision-making. Asst. Prof. Milča met with UPSA management to discuss opportunities for deeper collaboration in study programme development, joint research initiatives, and future mobility activities.

The visit strengthened institutional partnership and broadened international learning opportunities for students and staff.

LATVIAN CIRCULAR ECONOMY FORUM 2025

On **5 November 2025**, the [**Latvian Circular Economy Forum 2025**](#) gathered entrepreneurs, researchers, policymakers, and educators at VEF Culture Palace to discuss the future of circularity in Latvia.

As part of the programme, **Edgars Čerkovskis** moderated the panel "**Circular Social Entrepreneurship: Inspiration and Opportunities**," featuring practitioners **Diana Pershtein-Lapiks** (New Door), **Inga Muižniece** (Sonido, LSUA), and **Agnese Rakovska** (Zvaigznāja komanda).

The discussion highlighted the essential role of social enterprises in driving circular solutions, community impact, and sustainable business practices. The panel was recognised as one of the event's standout sessions for its high added value and inspirational insights, underscoring that sustainability begins with people and their mindset.



UNDERSTANDING URBAN WATER CYCLES

On **12 November 2025**, a new episode of the [**Aprītprasme**](#) podcast was released, exploring one of the city's least visible yet most essential systems: urban wastewater treatment.



Guest **Māris Zviedris**, Head of the Biological Treatment Plant Daugavgrīva, explains what happens to water after it disappears down the drain – its journey from households to the Baltic Sea, the technologies used for purification, and the role of quality control and sludge reuse. The conversation also highlights the impact of residents' habits on water quality, the challenges of eutrophication, and the growing importance of innovation and digital solutions in sustainable water management.
